# **EARLY-ENTRY CLASSES | ENTR 201**

Early-entry classes allow you to explore subjects in which you excel or have a deep interest. These courses are taken in addition to your high-school classes but do not require approval from your high school to enroll. However, you may seek approval from your high school counselor for credit.

## WHY ENTR 201 EARLY-ENTRY

- ENTR 201 is a fully online, asynchronous 3-credit course that will fit into any schedule.
- ENTR 201 satisfies 3 General Education credits (B).
- Take a class that is not offered at your high school.
- Get a closer look into an academic area you might be interested in.
- Get a jump start on your post-secondary education.

# WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

ENTR 201 will introduce you to the entrepreneurial process, evaluating the market feasibility of new products and business ideas, and launching an entrepreneurial venture. You will analyze social structures that predict human behaviors and affect consumer decision-making through practical hands-on exercises. Building on researched theories surrounding various ideation methods, such as design thinking, you will apply higher-level problem-solving skills to discover core customer problems and generate original solutions.

# **ELIGIBILITY** REQUIREMENTS

If you are a student in grades 10, 11, and 12, you may be eligible to take early-entry courses through NDSU. We recommend you have a GPA of 3.0 or higher. You should first speak with your high-school counselor or teachers to determine your academic readiness to participate in a college-level class. Early-entry classes have a discounted tuition rate and **may have a scholarship available to you.** Take advantage of this opportunity to get ahead on your degree and save money too!

#### **APPLICATION** INFORMATION

Follow these steps for the early-entry application process at NDSU.

- 3. Complete the FREE application for admission.
- Be sure to select Early Entry as your admit type.

### TUITION AND FEES

Early-entry classes are charged at about a third of the cost per credit of standard undergraduate tuition. Because as an early-entry student you do not pay full student fees, you will have to pay separately to use the wellness center, get student tickets to sporting events, or checkout materials from the campus library.
